
## **Outriders Horse Club**

At the November meeting a veterinarian visited the club and provided education on equine first aid. Members made their own 1<sup>st</sup> aid kits to keep in their trailers!





The summit includes keynote talks, interactive sessions, and networking opportunities that highlight education and career pathways in oncology, biomedical science, and healthcare innovation.

We seek teacher recommendations for high school students in their junior and senior years who are interested in healthcare and cancer-related careers. Students must submit the acceptance survey and forms by **Friday, January 30,** 2026

There is a **100-student limit**, and we are considering students from all over the state of Kentucky. Please prioritize juniors and seniors, as younger students will have future opportunities to attend upcoming events.

Student participation in the conference is voluntary and is not tied to school programming or academic credit.

## COUNTRY MORNING CASSEROLE


## Ingredients:

- 2 cups whole-wheat bread, cut into cubes
- 1 cup shredded low-fat cheddar cheese
- 6 eggs
- 1 cup skim milk
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper
- 1 cup frozen broccoli florets
- 1/2 bell pepper, roughly chopped
- ½ onion, chopped

## **Directions:**

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. In a 7-by-11-inch or 9-by-9-inch pan, layer bread cubes and shredded cheddar.
- 3. In a medium bowl, mix eggs, milk, salt, garlic powder, pepper and vegetables. Pour over bread.
- 4. Bake for approximately one hour (check periodically) or until eggs have set.
